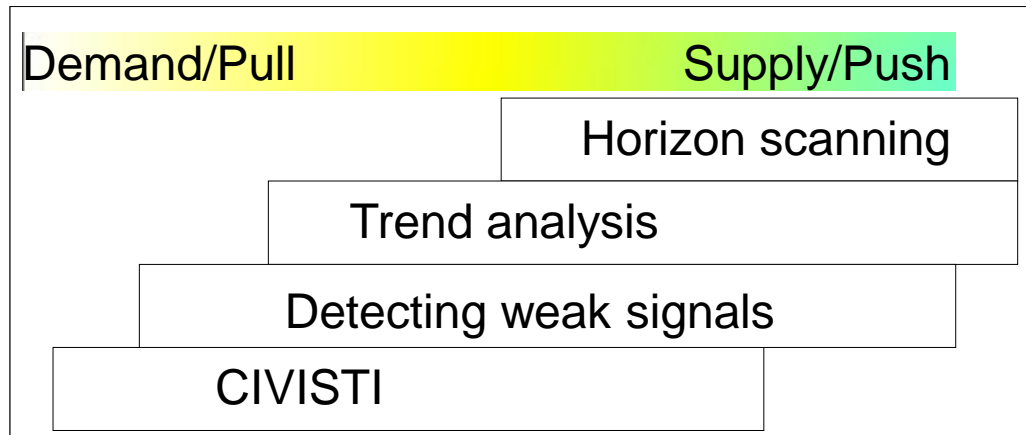

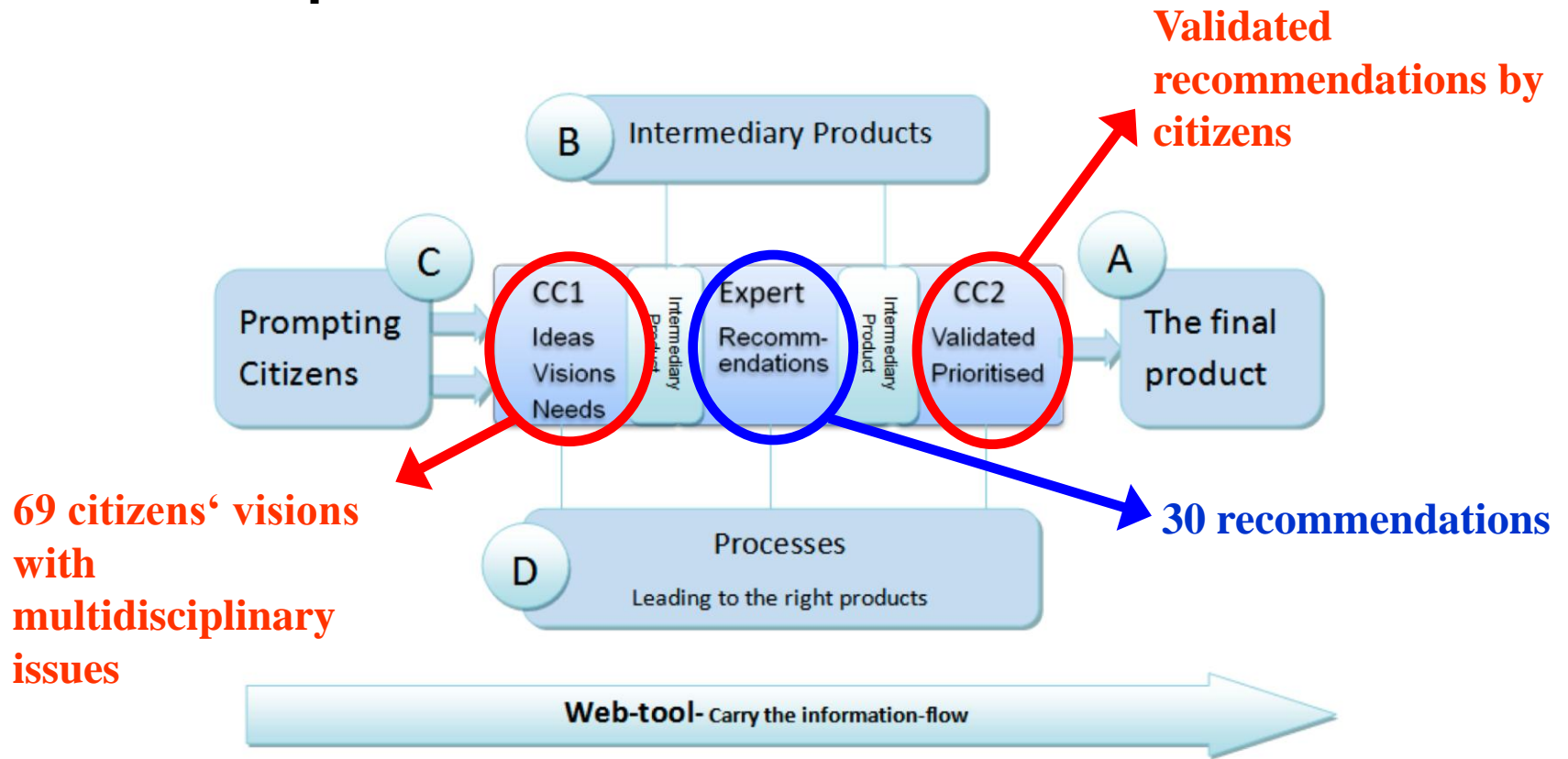
CIVISTI – Participatory demand-side foresight



CIVISTI (Citizen Visions on Science, Technology and Innovation) is part of the development towards better forward-looking strategic thinking to

- identify new and emerging relevant long-term issues
- produce a set of policy options/recommendations
- develop a novel method for citizen consultation in foresight

CIVISTI steps and results

Outcome

- 69 visions of citizens from 7 EU countries contain 37 issues that have been condensed to 30 recommendations for Horizon 2020
