Models in Bioethics

- Postliberal model

(postmodern, communitarian, feminist and other critiques of the liberal model)

Autonomy and Incompetence in Ageing Society

Prevalence of dementia in Europe:

- 60 - 64 years – 0,9%
- 65 - 69 years – 1,3 - 1,5%
- 70 - 74 years – 3,2 - 3,6%,
- 75 - 79 years – 5,8 - 6,0%
- 80 - 84 years – 11,8 - 12,2%
- 85+ years – 24,5 - 24,8 %.
