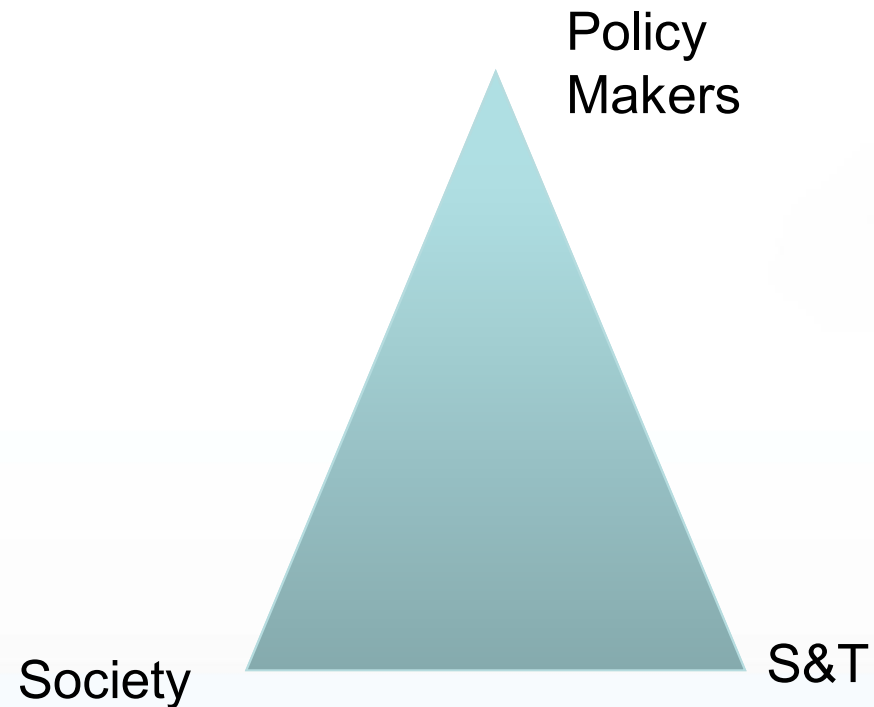
# An original concept
